Guest Speaker

Raechel Osborne has been the driving force behind Kapiti Youth Support since KYS started 21 years ago. Raechel is a nurse by training and our club awarded her a Paul Harris Fellowship a few years ago.

KYS is a charitable trust and provides support to youth aged between 10-25 years old on the Kapiti Coast. KYS has 5400 clients and 40 staff operating from 5 sites on the Kapiti Coast. Services cover health, contraception, mental health, budgeting, parenting and suicide. In the year 2017, 1875 doctor and nurse consultations were provided.

KYS funding is vulnerable to government policy changes.

A charity store is operated at 39 Kapiti Road to assist funding. Members are requested to check it out!

Raechel played a video showing former Youth Representatives of KYS talk about the impact KYS has had on their lives.

Member talk

Chris Dentice talked about his formative years as an only child growing up in Island Bay. Chris was overweight and a smoker as a youngster but became a 440 yard running champion (yard is an ancient unit of measure). Chris joined the valuation department as a cadet after leaving school. Salary five pounds per week (a pound is an ancient unit of currency which equal 2 dollars). Chris rode to Auckland on a Vespa scooter to work for his fourth year and was let loose calculating rating values in year 5, Auckland rates have continued to rise ever since. In Auckland Chris was a member of the Valuation Department rugby team and wore a shirt with VD on it. Chris “won” the ballot for compulsory military service.

Chris has been a valuer on the Kapiti Coast since 1980 and in 2003 formed his current firm Kapiti Valuations.
